KALBĖJIMO ĮSKAITOS UŽDUOTYS

Pirmajam poros mokiniui (A)

2009 m. balandžio 22 d. (antroji įskaitos diena)

PAAIŠKINIMAI:


- Kalbėjimo įskaitos užduočių skaičius, skiriamas vienai vertinimo grupei, 4 mokinio A įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai ir 4 mokinio B įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai.
- Kiekviename įskaitos bilietų rinkinyje yra po 8 bilietus, todėl ruošimosi patalpoje turi būti paruoštos 8 kortelės su bilietų numeriais (1–8).
- Ruošimosi patalpoje vienu metu ruošiasi 1 mokinių pora: mokinys A ir mokinys B. Abu mokiniai ruošiasi atskirai, nebendraudami tarpusavyje. Ruošimosi laikas 15 min. Baigę ruoštis, mokiniai pasiima ruošimosi lapus, įskaitos bilietų rinkinius palieka ruošimosi kambaryje, o atsakinėjimo patalpoje gauna tokius pačius iskaitos bilietų rinkinius.
- Atsakinėjimo patalpoje turi būti 3 įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai A ir 3 įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai B: po vieną egzaminuotojui, vertintojui ir mokinių porai.
- Mokinių atsakinėjimą organizuoja egzaminuotojas tokiu būdu: pirmiausia paprašo mokinių prisistatyti, paduoda jiems atitinkamus kalbėjimo įskaitos bilietų rinkinius ir paprašo mokinį A atlikti pirmąją užduotį. Po to pirmąją užduotį atlieka mokinys B. Antrąją užduotį abu mokiniai atlieka kartu. Egzaminuotojas atsakinėjančių mokinių pokalbyje nedalyvauja, bet prireikus gali paraginti kalbėti.
- Mokinio kalbėjimas vertinamas vadovaujantis Užsienio kalbos kalbėjimo įskaitos programoje
 pateikta kalbėjimo vertinimo lentele. Vertintojas įvertinimą užrašo kalbėjimo vertinimo lape, kurio
 forma įdėta duomenų perdavimo sistemoje KELTAS.

MONOLOGUE

Time: 3–4 minutes

Topic: Public Transport

Task: Look through the results of the survey and give a talk answering the questions below.



- 1. Interpret the data of the survey. Which group would you belong to?
- 2. What are the advantages of using the public transport?
- 3. How do you get to your school: on foot, by bus/trolley-bus/minibus or by car? Have you ever been late to school due to traffic jams, accidents or bad driving conditions? If yes, describe that situation. If not, what could you suggest in order to reduce traffic jams in big cities at rush hours?

DIALOGUE

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: 'Vilnius 2009 Ambassador' Programme

Situation:

Your partner and you saw an advertisement at www.info@vilnius2009.lt which offered to promote Vilnius and Lithuania for the National Programme 'Vilnius – European Capital of Culture 2009' and got interested in it. You both are willing to spread information about the country among your friends and new acquaintances inviting them to come to Lithuania and visit Vilnius.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to join in the programme and become ambassadors of Vilnius and Lithuania:

- reasons for joining in;
- how to become an ambassador (to fill in a registration form, to answer the questionnaire, to get an Ambassador's Pack);
- activities of an ambassador (to make presentations, to send photos of Vilnius and other places in Lithuania, to write poems/songs about Vilnius and Lithuania, to answer questions, etc);
- presentation of favourite places in Vilnius online;
- creation of the motto (a phrase or a short sentence).

MONOLOGUE

Time: 3–4 minutes Topic: **Shopping**

Task: Look through the results of the survey and give a talk answering the questions below.



- 1. Interpret the data of the survey. Which group would you belong to?
- 2. What are the advantages of shopping in shopping centres and supermarkets?
- 3. What's your attitude towards shopping: is it a relaxing or an unpleasant activity for you? What shops are your favourite? Why?

DIALOGUE

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: Strange Hair and Mismatched Clothes Show

Situation:

Your partner and you belong to the Students' Council and are responsible for organization of cultural events. This year you have decided to focus on creativity and individuality of students and are planning to organize Strange Hair and Mismatched Clothes Show.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to prepare for the show:


- ways to inform about the show and ways to register participants;

Topic: Un/Healthy Habits

- 2. What are the positive effects of 8-hour sleep on health? How can you describe your sleeping habits? Is there something you could improve? Explain what.
- 3. What else helps young people to stay fit and be in a good mood? Consider healthy eating habits, exercising and friendly relationships with people.

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: Educational Trip to Grūtas Park

Situation:

Your partner and you never miss a chance to travel and learn new things. When your history teacher offered your class to go to Grūtas Park and explore the symbols of the country's past, you not only accepted the offer but also volunteered to help her/him in organizing this trip.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to get ready for the trip:

- advantages of living in a free country;
- documentation needed for the trip (list of pupils, school director's permission, pupils' contact phones, etc);
- behaviour requirements for pupils on the trip;
- other possible interesting sights on the way;
- places to eat and have a rest.



- possible project evaluation criteria (creativity, design quality, ecological decisions, etc).




Discuss the issues with your partner in order to define the actions needed for the preparation of the competition:

- aims of the project;
- best way to inform school administration and canteen workers about the project;
- number of episodes of good behaviour and appropriate table manners;
- necessity to film interviews with problematic pupils;
- suggestions how to improve table manners at school.



- post-project activities (describing events online, demonstrating photos online, writing a short article to the local newspaper, etc).


