



ANGLŲ KALBA

KALBĖJIMO ĮSKAITOS UŽDUOTYS

Antrajam poros mokiniui (B)

2009 m. balandžio 22 d. (antroji įskaitos diena)

PAAIŠKINIMAI:

- Kalbėjimo įskaitos užduočių skaičius, skiriamas vienai vertinimo grupei, – 4 mokinio A įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai ir 4 mokinio B įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai.
- Kiekviename įskaitos bilietų rinkinyje yra po 8 bilietus, todėl ruošimosi patalpoje turi būti paruoštos 8 kortelės su bilietų numeriais (1–8).
- Ruošimosi patalpoje vienu metu ruošiasi 1 mokinių pora: mokinys A ir mokinys B. Abu mokiniai ruošiasi atskirai, nebendraudami tarpusavyje. Ruošimosi laikas – 15 min. Baigę ruoštis, mokiniai pasiima ruošimosi lapus, įskaitos bilietų rinkinius palieka ruošimosi kambarį, o atsakinėjimo patalpoje gauna tokius pačius įskaitos bilietų rinkinius.
- Atsakinėjimo patalpoje turi būti 3 įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai A ir 3 įskaitos bilietų rinkiniai B: po vieną egzaminuotojui, vertintojui ir mokinių porai.
- Mokinių atsakinėjimą organizuoja egzaminuotojas tokiu būdu: pirmiausia paprašo mokinių prisistatyti, paduoda jiems atitinkamus kalbėjimo įskaitos bilietų rinkinius ir paprašo mokinį A atlikti pirmąją užduotį. Po to pirmąją užduotį atlieka mokinys B. Antrąją užduotį abu mokiniai atlieka kartu. Egzaminuotojas atsakinėjančių mokinių pokalbyje nedalyvauja, bet prireikus gali paraginti kalbėti.
- Mokinio kalbėjimas vertinamas vadovaujantis Užsienio kalbos kalbėjimo įskaitos programoje pateikta kalbėjimo vertinimo lentelė. Vertintojas įvertinimą užrašo kalbėjimo vertinimo lape, kurio forma įdėta duomenų perdavimo sistemoje KELTSAS.

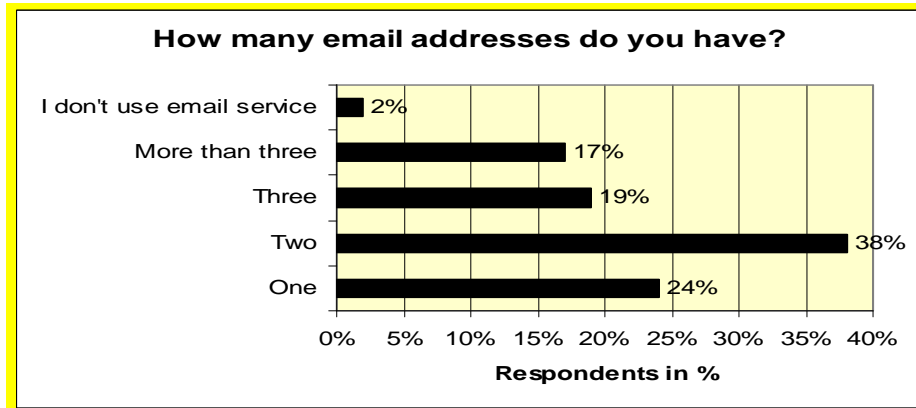

You both are willing to spread information about the country among your friends and new acquaintances inviting them to come to Lithuania and visit Vilnius.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to join in the programme and become ambassadors of Vilnius and Lithuania:

- aims of the programme;
- possible audience (friends, acquaintances, email friends, bloggers, etc);
- ways to communicate with people;
- different aspects of Vilnius' uniqueness;
- ways to present favourite places in Lithuania online.

Student A starts the conversation.

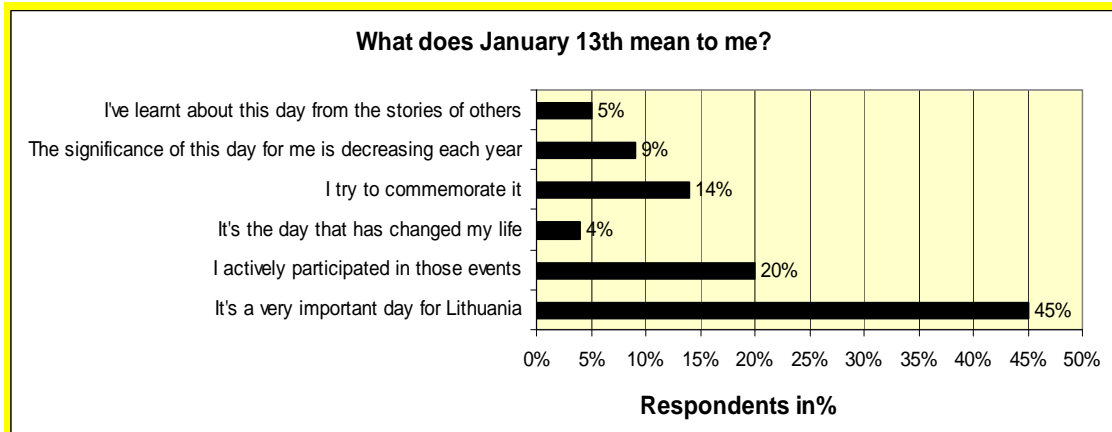

Task: Look through the results of the survey and give a talk answering the questions below.



1. Interpret the data of the survey. Which group(s) would you belong to?
2. Why is this holiday called Defenders' of Freedom Day? Is it important for you or not to live in a free and independent country? Why?
3. How is January 13th commemorated at your school, town or village? Have you participated in the actions/events devoted to this holiday? If yes, describe your experience. If not, explain what Motherland means to you.

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: **Strange Hair and Mismatched Clothes Show**

Situation:

Your partner and you belong to the Students' Council and are responsible for organization of cultural events. This year you have decided to focus on creativity and individuality of students and are planning to organize Strange Hair and Mismatched Clothes Show.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to prepare a programme of the show:

- reasons for organizing this show;
- length of the show;
- criteria for choosing strange hair and clothes (uniqueness of hair style, match of hair and clothes styles, interesting colours and forms);
- music choice;
- prizes for the most unusual hair and clothes.

You start the conversation.

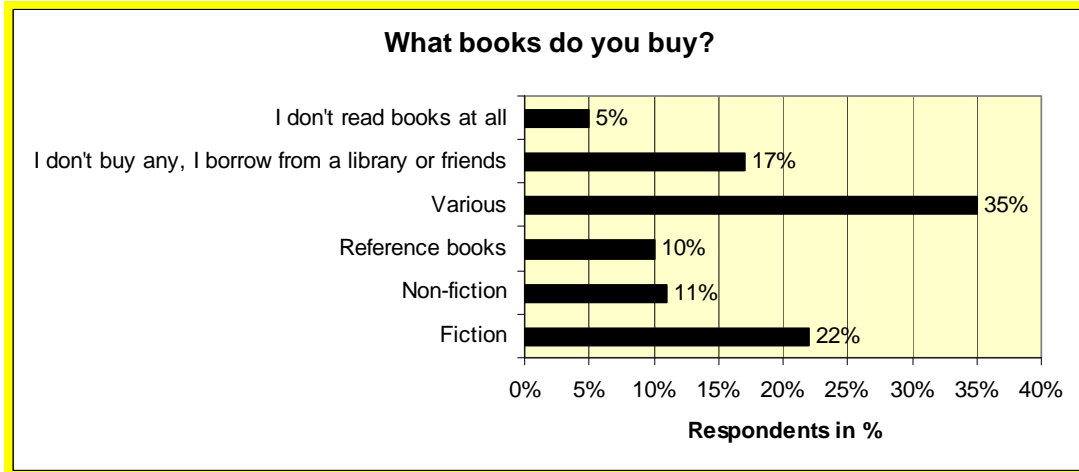

- means of transport;
- approximate budget for the trip;
- possible educational activities in Grūtas Park.

You start the conversation.

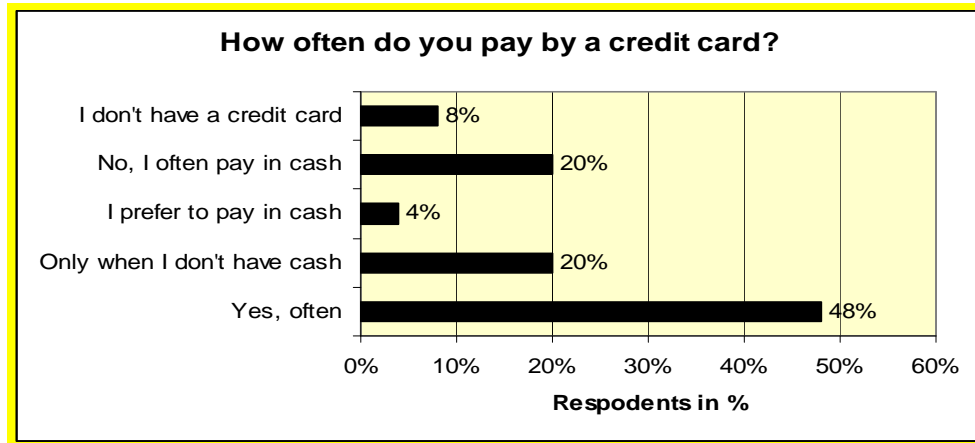

- details of outside environment/green space creation;
- use of technological advancement (economical computerized heating, lightning and safety systems, recycling and reuse policy);
- distribution of work (who will do what).

Student A starts the conversation.

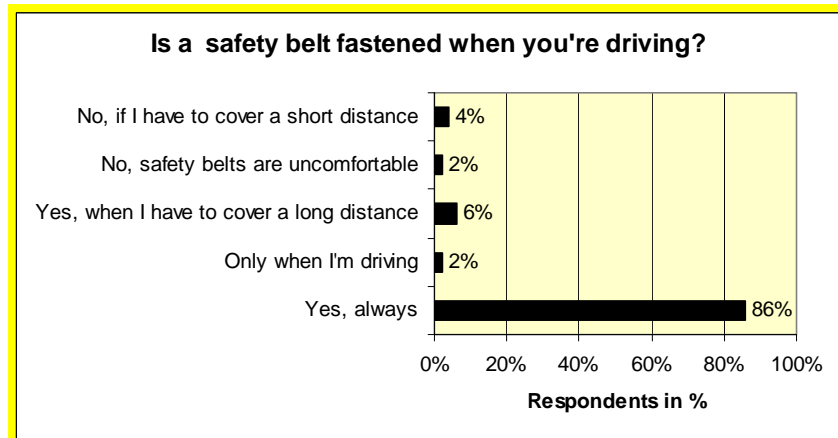

Topic: **Unsafe Driving**

Task: Look through the results of the survey and give a talk answering the questions below.



1. Interpret the data of the survey. If you drive a car, which group do you belong to? If not, which group would you belong to, if you drove a car?
2. What else makes driving risky? Consider driver's inexperience, the violation of driving rules such as overspeeding and a poor technical condition of a car.
3. What measures should be taken by the Government to stop the 'War on Roads'? Describe an ideal driver.

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: **Public Speaking Competition at School**

Situation:

Your English teacher offered your partner and you to participate in the Public Speaking Competition the theme being 'All the world's the stage'. S/he also said that the winner would present school at the regional/town competition later. As you both enjoy speaking English, you think it's worth trying.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to define the actions needed for the preparation of the competition:

- importance of public speaking in one's life;
- free interpretation of the given theme;
- delivery of the speech (pauses, intonation, eye contact, gestures, etc);
- length of a speech (6 minutes);
- ways to cope with fear/stress.

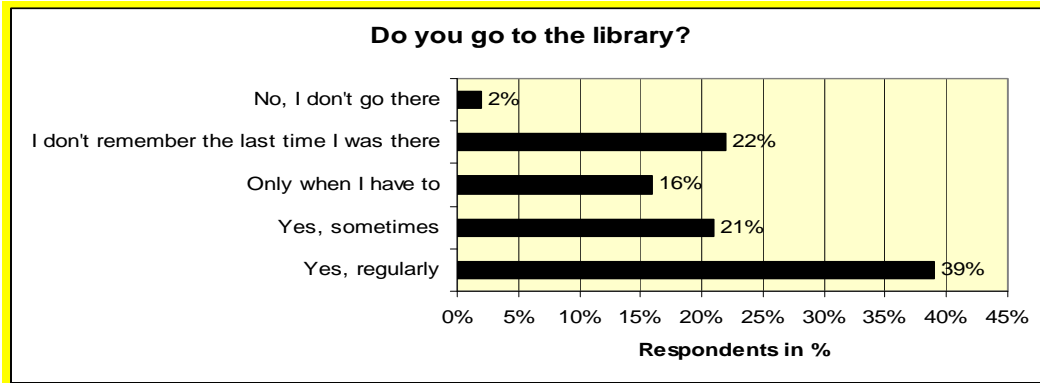

3. Are you a reader of your school library? If yes, explain how useful it is for you. If not, explain why you don't go there.

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: **Video Project on Table Manners**

Situation:

Your partner and you are members of the Students' Council. You have decided to pay pupils' attention to their behaviour at school canteen and to their table manners which are problematic in most cases. To prove this and initiate a discussion on this issue you have decided to make a video.

Discuss the issues with your partner in order to have a clear action plan of the video project:

- best time to film pupils at the canteen;
- number of days to do the filming;
- possible assistants and consultants in film making;
- video rules of appropriate table manners (queueing, bringing and placing the food on the table, taking dishes away, using utensils in the right way, being polite with kitchen workers and peers, etc);
- time and place to demonstrate the film and discuss it.

Student A starts the conversation.

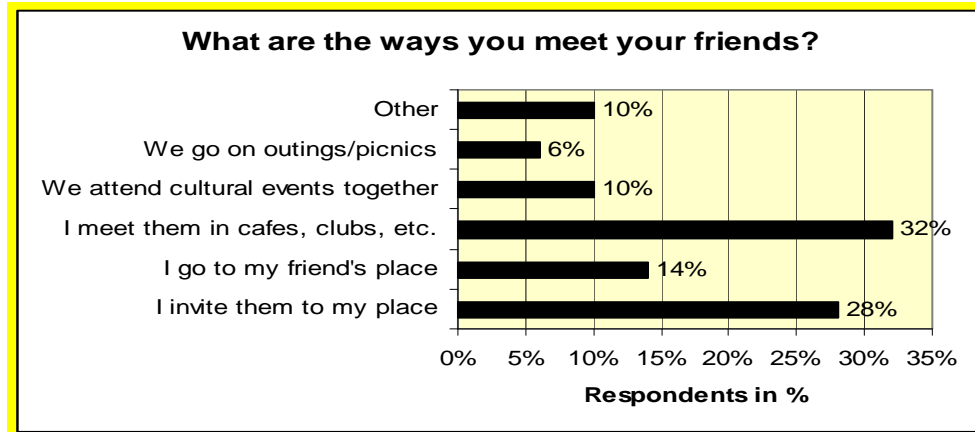

You start the conversation.

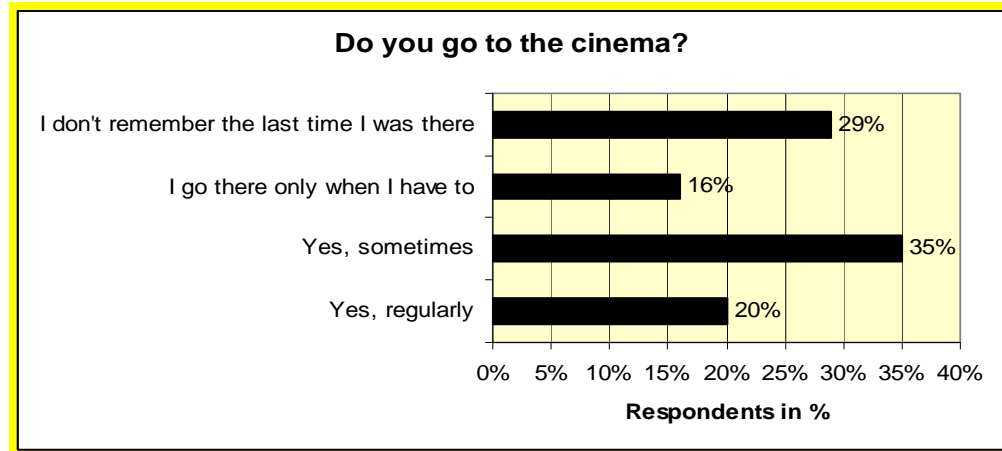
